### Donate

Kickstart your fundraising with a personal donation! This demonstrates your commitment to your campaign and is a great opportunity to ask friends and family to match your own donation.

### Share

Tell your network why Game On Cancer is important to you by sharing your story on your fundraising webpage. Try answering this question: what motivated you to get in the game?

## Get social

Post your fundraising page on social media! Let your friends know who Game On Cancer is and what we do, and share your story and fundraising goal on Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram and Twitter. Even if someone can't donate right now, ask them to share your post — this helps boost your campaign at no cost!

## Email

Choose 10 people from your network to email. Not sure what to say? We've got it covered! Find pre-written email drafts in your Participant Center by logging in at the upper righthand corner of our website.

### Send a thank-you

Send personal thank you notes to everyone who supports your campaign.

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# Frequently asked questions

### How many people are required to form a team?

There is no minimum number required for a team. Each team member must meet their individual fundraising goal of \$250 to secure an invitation to our Field Day event at Ford Field.

#### If we have a fundraising event, how do we submit the funds we raise?

Option 1: Personally collect all funds (cash and checks made out to you) at the conclusion of your event and make one online deposit for the full amount to your Game On Cancer page.

Option 2: Personally collect all funds (cash and checks made out to you) and write ONE check to Game On Cancer for the full amount. Include your team name or individual fundraiser name(s) with your check so we can apply the funds toward your goal.

#### Who should checks be written out to?
